# READING CHALLENGES AROUT AROUT TRACKER

This resource is designed to provide accountability for students' reading while encouraging them to think deeply about their reading. Students will read for at least 20 minutes each day. Then, they'll review a Reading Choice Board filled with 16 creative reading response challenges. Students will select a reading response to complete on a separate piece of notebook paper. Finally, they'll track their progress as they complete a chart and color in books on the Reading Tracker. They can track their reading and complete tasks for 10 days (or two weeks).

This resource includes everything you and students will need to be successful: Detailed Directions Page, Reading Choice Board (with fun tasks), a Reading Tracker, and even a Grading Rubric.

### IDEAS

#### IN THE CLASSROOM:

- Use with an INDEPENDENT READING PROGRAM.
- Have students select different challenges to share in LITERATURE (IRCLES.
- Let students choose a task for HOMEWORK.
- Complete the challenges while reading a SHORT STORY.

#### REMOTE LEARNING:

- PRINT AND PHOTOCOPY the Directions Page, Choice Board, and Reading Tracker for students. Have students work on them at home while reading a book of their choice.
- EMAIL parents the student materials to share with their child.




RUBRIC - If you would like to evaluate students' responses, a 10-point rubric is provided. You might have students select their 3 favorite responses for a grade.





#### **HOW TO COMPLETE THE CHALLENGES & TRACKER**

STEP 18 Choose a book to read each day.

STEP 28 Read for at least 20 minutes.

STEP 38 Review the reading response challenges on the Reading Response Choice Board. Choose a reading response that you can complete in a detailed manner.

STEP 48 Complete the challenge that you chose on a piece of paper.

• Write a lot.

- Provide textual evidence from your reading.
- Include direct quotations.
- Show quality effort.

STEP 5% Re-read your response.

- Make corrections
- Extend your responses

STEP 68 Fill in the Reading Tracker.

Write each response on a piece of lined paper. Set up a heading at the top of your paper when you write your response. Include:

- Your NAME
- The PAGES you READ
- The CHALLENGE you are responding to. Write the number of the challenge.
